GOSPEL THE PARABLE OF THE GOOD SAMARITAN (LUKE 10:25-37)

LEADER: A reading from the Holy Gospel of Luke.

Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus.

"Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?"

He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself."

And Jesus said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?"

Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.



But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

READER: We pray for people we know who are burdened with worries or sickness. We pray for our parents, families and friends. (pause)

Through your Mercy O Lord, (R) hear our prayer.

READER: We pray together with Mary, Mother of Mercy, our model of love and compassion.

ALL: Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with you.

Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus.

Holy Mary, Mother of God,

Pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.

Amen.

READER: Let us pray in silence for those prayers that are in our hearts. (pause)

Though your Mercy O Lord, (R) hear our prayer.



PRAYER FOR THE JUBILEE/CONCLUDING PRAYER

Lord Jesus Christ,
you have taught us to be merciful like our heavenly Father,
and have told us that whoever sees you sees God.
Show us the loving gaze that freed Zacchaeus
and made Peter weep after his betrayal.
