Dear Marist Friends

First Light – Reveal the Spirit is the 2024 theme for the Marists of Champagnat.

I should point out that the process of determining the theme takes some months. A myriad of ideas are assembled; then follows a process of dialogue and discernment, consultation, and consideration.

Then there's a second process to determine the image that will accompany the theme. The purpose is to provide a visual representation of the theme that captures attention and special dimensions of the intended message. Colours and overall design are crucial. Simplicity is favoured. This year the image is a photograph, consciously selected because of what it depicts about the theme.

The final phase involves creating the program that will present the new annual theme. Concepts are arranged and sequenced. Resources are designed and collected. Prayers and reflection periods are introduced. Discussion processes are incorporated. The elements are pieced together to create a whole presentation that will bring alive the theme as a meaningful formative experience.

You can imagine this entire process takes significant time and requires considerable creative energy. I congratulate the Mission and Life Formation Team on First Light. I won't comment or elaborate on the theme, since Tony Clarke has provided a rich introduction in the pages ahead. Let me say, I believe everyone who experiences the First Light – Reveal the Spirit program will be touched and their faith, reawakened.

Of course, there is much more on offer for 2024 than First Light. There are the regular offerings of Footsteps and Footsteps II, In the Marist Way, and Hermitage Retreats. Some are virtual experiences; some are residential opportunities. Offerings cover the needs of school leaders and staff, Association members and others who wish to immerse themselves in Marist spirituality.

Take up and read this booklet. Select for yourself, or your staff, what you believe will be most helpful as you seek to deepen your commitment to Marist mission, life and spirit. I pray that 2024 will be a year that reveals the spirit to you.

## FIRST LIGHT *Reveal the Spirit*

In a classical rabbinic story, the teacher asks the disciples: "When do you know it is dawn?" One says, "when you can distinguish a white thread from a black one." "No," says the teacher. "When you can see the outline of a tree against the horizon," ventures another. "No," says the teacher — to this and all other efforts to answer the question. Finally, he says, "when you can look into the eyes of an 'other', a stranger, and see a brother or a sister, then it is dawn. Until then, it is still night."

The theme FIRST LIGHT invites us to recognise the world as the place in which we discover God. God's Spirit is in Creation. The first words of God were "Let there be light" (Gen 1:3), and with that our world dawned into existence. We can recognise and experience God's Spirit through the beauty and goodness of everything that the world holds and reveals, the spring buds on a tree, the warmth of the sun on your face, the sharing of a meal at a soup kitchen on a winter's day, in the eyes of a stranger. Everything reveals the presence of God (1 Cor 10:26).

At times God's Spirit can appear in dramatic bursts of light – through the brilliance of an electric sunrise that makes you fall momentarily still – when you recognise that the earth is indeed 'charged' with the glory of God!<sup>1</sup> Often though, it may appear without much fanfare; a small act of kindness, an unexpected word of affirmation from a classmate, a healing gesture of forgiveness. For the prophet Elijah, God's Spirit was experienced in the hush of a gentle breeze (1 Kings 19:12).

Sometimes it may be revealed in the darkest night when the weight of the world feels heaviest. Even the smallest light within us can shine brightest in the darkest times (2 Cor 4:6). We find further encouragement in the words of St Paul who reminds us that "everything brought into the light becomes light!". Everything can be transformed into light.

This light is the dwelling of the Holy Spirit with in each one of us, and if we can recognise the goodness and beauty within, it helps us to see it in others. It is said that we don't see

things as they are, but we see things as we are. Eckhart Tolle wrote: "You do not become good by trying to be good, but by finding the goodness already within you, and allowing that goodness to emerge." Through an awareness of the goodness within ourselves – God's Spirit breathing through us – we too are transformed, and we become a gift of God's light for the world. We are changed, and the world is changed by us.

Saint Marcellin Champagnat believed that God's Spirit was always present and at work in the world, inspiring his mission and giving strength to his purpose. It is this gift of the Spirit that we as Marists want to share with others, the young, our colleagues, the stranger – of bringing people into the joy and freedom of the light of Christ – the Source of all Light:

"I am the Light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the Light of life." (Jn 8:12)

We pray that the Holy Spirit illuminates our minds and hearts to recognise and know God's presence in the breath-taking and ordinary encounters of our life. We pray that our lives will be transformed by God's Spirit, making known the presence of God in the world and within us:

"You are the light of the world... let your light shine." (Mt 5:14-16)

# FIRST LIGHT

Reveal the Spirit

Matthew 5:14-16

## Image Reflection

God is revealed uniquely to each of us and just as the light falls on each rock in this 80-metre chasm, so too the Holy Spirit illuminates and reveals God's presence to us – in the world and in each one of us.

The light and passageway of Standley Chasm draws you in, like a natural cathedral, but also invites you to look around the corner and explore further. The photographer, Nick Psomiadis describes the scene... the sheer cliffs glowing in sunlight, a spectacular scene to behold as the sun passes over the chasm.

It took Nick three days to achieve this photograph because the chasm only receives light directly at a particular moment. You can notice the presence of light as the narrow vista changes colour at dawn, but the full strength of the sun is only at an appointed time of the day.

The notion of visibility and invisibility is central to Aboriginal thinking and rays of light that rouse the spirit is central to their spirituality. Standley Chasm is known traditionally as Angkerle Atwatye, meaning 'Gap of Water' and is a place of deep cultural significance to Western Arrernte people as a sacred site of women's dreaming and birthing.

The chasm was later named after Ida Standley, the first school teacher in the West MacDonnell Ranges. For fifteen years, Ida Standley was the only government teacher in Central Australia and helped to give Aboriginal children a basic education. Ida was highly respected and described by the press as the 'beloved lady'.

## STAFF SPIRITUALITY PROGRAM 2024

The National Staff Spirituality Program invites participants to reflect upon the presence of God as revealed in the world and to be transformed by the Spirit for the evangelising mission of making Jesus known and loved.

“You do not become good by trying to be good, but by finding the goodness that is already within you, and allowing that goodness to emerge. But it can only emerge if something fundamental changes in your state of consciousness.”

These words from Eckhart Tolle express the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and the importance of becoming aware of the light within us. Through this awareness, we are transformed and spiritually gifted to be God’s light for others.

Participants will:

- Grow in an understanding of the Holy Spirit as God’s presence in the world
- Deepen an awareness of the Holy Spirit, recognising its wisdom, power, healing and beauty
- Discover ways that the Spirit is revealed through encounter and relationship
- Explore ways that the Holy Spirit is a gift to be shared with others

The program provides opportunities to:

- Enter more deeply into the human experience of the world through art, environment and society
- Facilitate contemplative reflection which invites participants to be open to the gifts of the Holy Spirit
- Examine the example of discipleship contained in the scriptures with particular reference to Mary Magdalene’s encounter of Jesus
- Discern how Catholic educators assist students to encounter the inner world of the Spirit

RAINFOREST TO THE REEF RETREAT | \$780.00\***

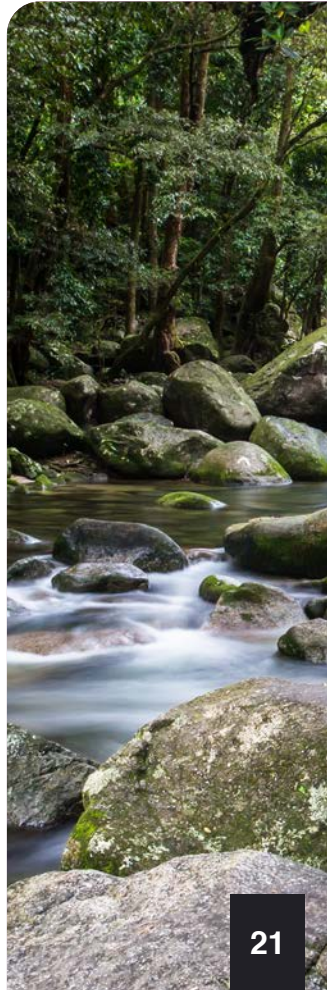

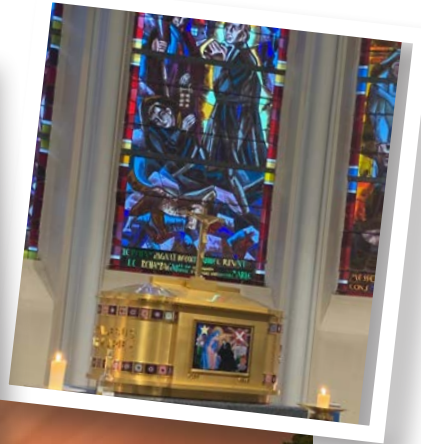
## MARIST PILGRIMAGE | \$14,500.00

## LITURGICAL MUSIC LEADERS' WORKSHOP | \$80.00\*

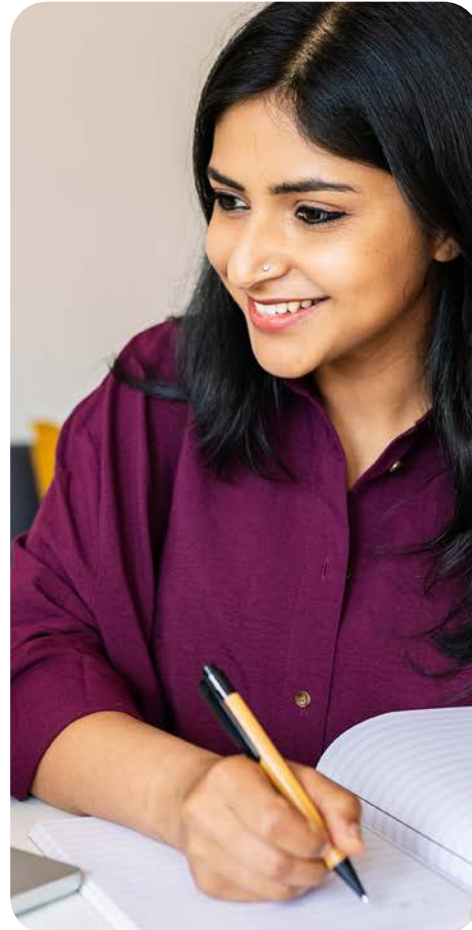

This course aims to help participants gain a deeper understanding of the person of Mary and offers opportunities to contemplate the role she played within the faith life of the early Christian community.

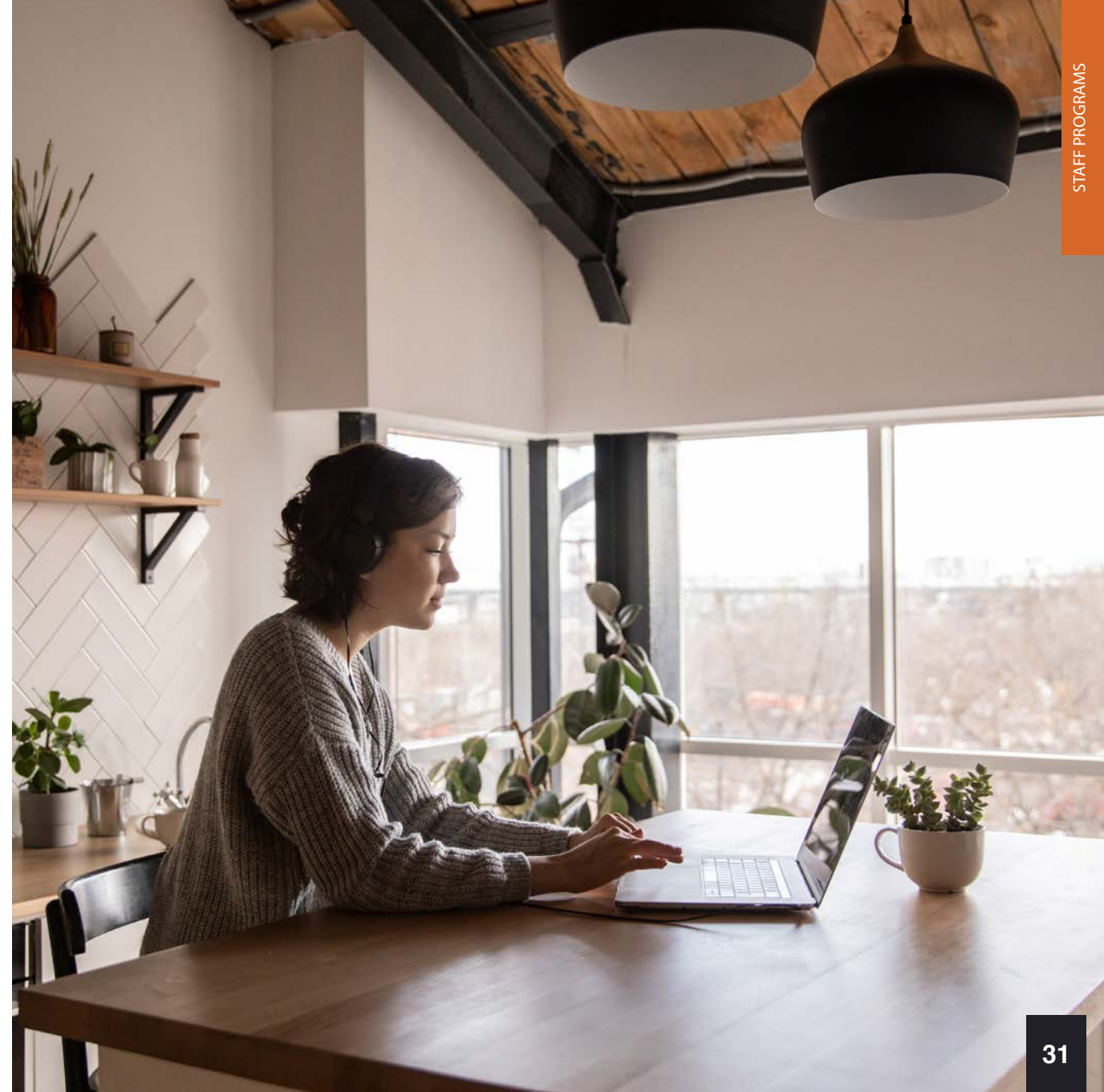

## TERTIARY, DIOCESAN, MARIST SCHOOLS AUSTRALIA AND PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

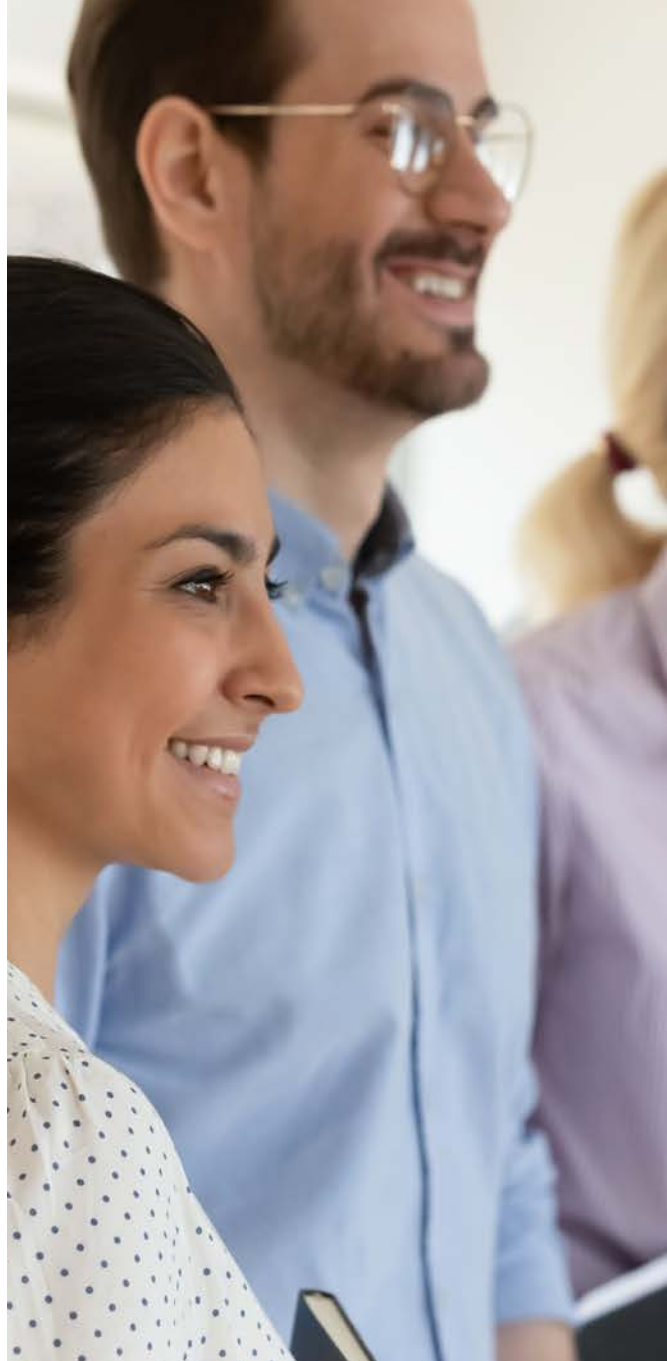
A number of Marist programs have university recognition and are also recognised by dioceses and state-based professional and educational bodies for meeting annual professional learning requirements.

The following programs have been recognised by Australian Catholic University (ACU), University of Notre Dame Australia (UNDA), and Broken Bay Institute BBI – The Australian Institute of Theological Education at the Masters level (AQF level 9):

1. Footsteps 1 - Making Jesus Christ Known and Loved
2. Footsteps 2 - Making Jesus Christ Known and Loved
3. Marist Pilgrimage & Study Tour
4. Marist Educational Leadership
5. Leadership from a Marian Perspective

### Graduate Certificate Unit in Marist Methodology

This series of 12 two-hour modules are taught for staff in Marist Schools in South Australia as part of the University of South Australia's Graduate Certificate Course. It is a collaboration between the university, Catholic Education South Australia and the Marists and is held in Adelaide. The course aims to help teachers apply Marist pedagogy in their professional practice, serving to promote the flourishing of life for every child and the flourishing of the human community in light of the Catholic Christian understanding of the human person (or Catholic Christian Anthropology (CCA)).



### Marist Educational Leadership\*

This is a Postgraduate Masters level course offered annually for people studying at university, for those seeking accreditation with a Catholic Education authority, or for those who simply wish to learn more about Marist Leadership. The program focuses on educational leadership from a Marist perspective, internationally and nationally, at both the system and school levels. It addresses the Marist enterprise within the context of the Catholic Church and local cultures.

In 2024, this course will be offered in person at the Marist Centre Sydney. The chance to come together face to face for the first time in 4 years will be an invaluable opportunity for those seeking to develop their leadership skills in a Marist environment. For those seeking Tertiary Recognition, there will be additional online commitments and course work.

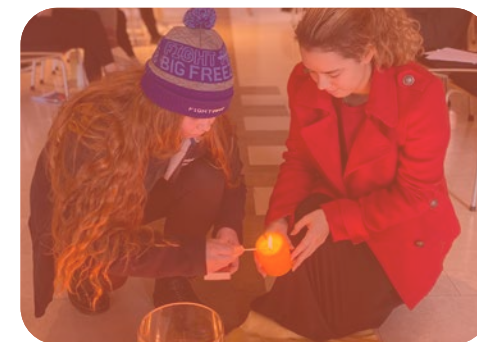

## Marist Schools Australia

... is a family of 56 schools which draw on Marist spirituality and Marist educational practice to help them to shape their identity and mission as Catholic schools. Of these schools, 12 are solely governed by the Board of Marist Schools Australia Ltd and the rest are conducted in various partnership arrangements with dioceses and parishes. MSA schools, which help to educate over 40,000 young Australians, are grouped into three geographical Regions. Each Region is led by a Director who is advised by a MSA Regional Council.

## Marist Youth Ministry

... is a ministry aimed at young people aged between 12 and 25. MYM supports school-based and young adult programs. The principal school involvement is through the six-year Christian leadership program known as Game Changers. A suite of post-school opportunities include prayer and worship, service and solidarity, forums and festivals, together with a range of local and international volunteering opportunities. MYM operates in all MSA Regions.

## Marist180

... is the social welfare arm of the Association. Marist180 has a range of programs and services that connect with and support young people and families in most critical need. It is headquartered in Western Sydney with a presence in Orange, Newcastle, Canberra and Brisbane. Marist180 provides skills training and services for Aboriginal engagement, homelessness, family preservation and refugee settlement. They also provide Intensive Therapeutic Care for young people living in Marist180 out-of-home care.

## Australian Marist Solidarity

... is a ministry for aid and development work through Asia and the Pacific Islands. Australian Marist Solidarity, a registered NGO, works with the people in this region through projects that empower local communities to take their own path to development, with an emphasis on redressing poverty through the provision of education. It also offers educational and support services for MSA schools.
