




PROGRAMS AND EVENTS 2021

Dear Friends

None of us could have imagined the dislocation that 2020 brought. We experienced things that we'd only read about: pandemic, curfews, lockdowns, border closures, economic recession. Some may be with us into 2021 and beyond. However, the challenges were borne and many people found inner reserves of resilience.

Our Marist family, like so many others, found alternative ways of gathering and celebrating. We Zoomed, Webexed or Facetimed our way through to each other. The less frenetic pace of life offered us more personal opportunities to read, ponder and pray.

Our Mission and Life Formation team responded creatively to the situation and to perceived needs. The weekly prayers proved most valuable, as did other prayer resources posted online. While face-to-face presentations of the 2020 *One Wild and Precious Life* program proved impossible after Term One, other ways were devised for sharing the richness of the theme. The podcast series, courses in accompaniment, the online Mid-Winter Retreat and other offerings were taken up enthusiastically – not just by Marists in Australia, but also by those beyond our shores.

In fact, the situation created by COVID-19, highlighted the importance of formation programs and their central role in helping to connect and enrich our Marist family.

I'm therefore delighted to introduce the Formation program for 2021 **Breathe: the Spirit of Life**. What is more important to us, to every human being and to creation itself, than breath? To breathe is to live! Exploring this theme together will help us live and grow as Marists. And of course, there are many other opportunities – all outlined in this booklet.

Take up and read, select and plan, come together to learn, believe and pray. May the breath of the Spirit move you.

In this moment of history we could not be more aware of how connected we are. An unknown virus spread from a largely unheard-of city to affect every human being on the planet. Pope Francis has been repeatedly reminding us that everything is connected (Laudato Si). I think we can say this realisation is now evident.

Perhaps nothing connects us more intimately than our breath. All life depends upon it and the exchange we have with our breathing green planet. With the average person taking an average of 20,000 breaths each day this subconscious activity can be easy to forget – until we can't do it anymore. It then becomes a symbol of 'life'.

There are some powerful images in Scripture capturing this image of breath as the source of life. The Book of Genesis describes God breathing into the nostrils of human beings the 'breath of life' to make them 'living' beings (Gen 2:7). Breath is also used to express the presence of God, and for Elijah, he experienced God in the sound of a gentle breeze or 'gentle breath' (1 Kings 19:12 cf. Timothy Radcliffe, 'Alive in God', p.266). It is often an evocative image of the Spirit (the Hebrew word for 'spirit', *ruah* is also the word for breath) and it was at Pentecost that Jesus *breathed* on the disciples saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit". The Holy Spirit is the Spirit who gives life. It unites, connects and pervades all that is: '**The Spirit of life** dwells in every human creature and calls us into a relationship with the Divine' (Laudato Si, 88). St Paul speaks of its power and proclaims that it is through Jesus Christ that the Holy Spirit gives life and freedom: "For the law of the **Spirit of life** in Christ Jesus has set you free" (Rm 8:2).

Richard Rohr describes the profound intimacy of our breath and the holy. To breathe is to experience the Divine...the *ruah* of God: "A rabbi taught this prayer to me many years ago. The Jews did not speak God's name but breathed it with an open mouth and throat: inhale-Yah; exhale-weh. By our very breathing, we are speaking the name of God and participating in God's breath. This is our first and our last word as we enter and leave the world (Rohr, On Being, p.65)."

As we breathe-in, we feed and nourish our physical bodies and nurture our inner life. But we can't hold our breath. After being fuelled by the breath of the love of God we are compelled to breathe-out, to give life to others and creation (Ezk 37:1-14). We are challenged to take up Pope Francis' invitation to become more consciously guardians of creation, as well as our brothers and sisters in humanity. Perhaps the moment has never been so urgent to take care of our planet and each other as we face together the uncertainty of a growing pandemic and its impact on the deterioration of life through social isolation, chronic loneliness, snowballing anxiety, economic uncertainty, and the loss of livelihood and life: "The virus of social injustice is as big a challenge as the medical response to COVID-19" (Pope Francis, August 19).

So in this year of the Plenary Council let us be conscious of our need to be attentive to the Spirit of life in discerning our way forward to be a source of fresh air and life as a Church for the world. May it be an opportunity for us to invite the Spirit of Jesus to enliven, energise, empower and unite us: The Spirit of the Lord is upon us! (Lk 4:18). Let us give thanks that we have been breathed to life by the great author of life and share in Elihu's prayer of gratitude: "The spirit of God has made me, and the breath of the Almighty gives me life." (Job 33:4)



When I care for my children in our families and help them grow – that is being part of *Ngkarte's* creating too. It is very precious to be able to share in *Ngkarte's* creating in our Universe.

FOR INDIVIDUAL AND GROUP REFLECTIONS






















The national Marist Staff Spirituality program for 2021 (4-hour program).

God's Spirit breathes life into all of creation, and it is that breath that provides life to all living things. The Christian life is one powered by the breath of God, transforming and calling us to be people who participate in the mission of Jesus: of building and empowering others into freedom.

Building upon our previous theme *One Wild and Precious Life*, we continue to examine how life on Earth is a sacred reality entrusted to each of us and of our responsibility to nurture harmonious relationships with all living things. We are challenged to take up Pope Francis' invitation to become guardians of creation and indeed all members of our human family; reminding us of God's desire for us to live in communion. Our response leads us to reflect on our call to mission: a mission that leads us out of fear and introspection to a renewed realisation of the importance of unity and human fraternity. As we live each day, the Holy Spirit continuously empowers us, breathing the glory and goodness of God into our every moment.

The aims of the program are to:

- grow in awareness of our responsibility towards creation (Earth) and to all its members, especially humanity, and, in particular, the poor
- explore how all Christians are called to grow together in unity and mission
- facilitate a rediscovery of the Love of God and the dignity of the human person
- discern ways in which to care for our common home as individuals and as a community
- examine how living a life animated by the Holy Spirit brings freedom and inspires us to give witness to Christ by our words and actions
- draw on contemporary and indigenous expressions of art and music to share moments of the Divine with others, especially young people

As Cardinal Walter Kasper reminds us, 'unity is a gift from above, stemming from and growing towards communion with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.' (A Handbook of Spiritual Ecumenism, pp. 10-11).

MARIST TERTIARY EDUCATION



TERTIARY, DIOCESAN, MARIST SCHOOLS AUSTRALIA AND PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

A number of Marist programs have university recognition and are also recognised by dioceses and state-based professional and educational bodies for meeting annual professional learning requirements.

The following programs have been recognised by Australian Catholic University at the Masters level (AQF level 9):

- 1. Footsteps 1 Making Jesus Christ Known and Loved
- 2. Footsteps 2 Making Jesus Christ Known and Loved
- 3. Marist Pilgrimage and Study Tour
- 4. Marist Educational Leadership Program
- 5. Leadership from a Marian Perspective

Masters and Graduate Certificate in Theology

The Australian Institute of Theological Education (BBI) offers the course RELT6032. People studying at Broken Bay can use the content from any of the five Marist programs listed above in their assignments for Broken Bay.

Graduate Certificate Unit in Marist Methodology

This series of 12, two-hour modules are taught biennially for staff in Marist Schools as part of the University of South Australia's Graduate Certificate Course. It is held in Adelaide. The course aims to help teachers apply Marist pedagogy in their professional practice serving to promote the flourishing of life for every child and the flourishing of the human community in light of the Catholic Christian understanding of the human person (or Catholic Christian Anthropology (CCA)).

Marist Educational Leadership*

The Australian Conference of the Marist Association acts in the name of the Church in four broad areas of ministry.

Marist Schools Australia

... is a family of 56 schools which draw on Marist spirituality and Marist educational practice to help them to shape their identity and mission as Catholic schools Of these schools 13 are solely governed by the Association and the rest are conducted in various partnership arrangements with dioceses and parishes. MSA schools which help to educate over 40,000 young Australians, are grouped into three geographical Regions. Each Region is led by a Director who is advised by an MSA Regional Council

Marist Youth Ministry

... is a ministry aimed at young people aged hetween 12 and 25 MYM supports schoolbased and young adult programs. The principal school involvement is through the six-vear Christian leadership program known as Game Changers. A suite of postschool opportunities include prayer and worship, service and solidarity, forums and festivals, together with a range of local and international volunteering opportunities, MYM operates in all MSA regions, with Regional Coordinators and a number of part-time MYM assistants and volunteers

Marist 180

is the social welfare arm of the Association Marist 180 has a range of programs and services that connect with and support voung people and families in most critical need It is headquartered in Western Sydney with a presence in Orange, Newcastle. Canberra and Brisbane Marist180 provides skills training and services for Aboriginal engagement, homelessness, family preservation and refugee settlement. They also provide Intensive Therapeutic Care for young people living in Marist180 outof-home care

Marist Solidarity

is the Association's agency for aid and development work through Asia and the Pacific Islands Australian Marist Solidarity, a registered NGO, works with the people in this region through projects that empower local communities to take their own path to development, with an emphasis on redressing poverty through the provision of education It also offers educational and support services for MSA schools involved in solidarity and immersion projects, and is the base for Marist Volunteers Australia

These ministries are currently supported by a number of Association-level teams and services: the MSA Leadership Team, the Mission and Life Formation Team, the Marist Association Pastoral Team, the Business Services Office, the Professiona Standards Office, Marist Music, and The Hermitage at Mittagong – the national Marist retreat and conference centre.
