This old Latin tag is highlighted by Archbishop Tim Costelloe in his introduction to the Australian National Catholic Education Commission's Framework for *Formation for Mission in Catholic Education*. The Marist Mission and Life Formation team worked with over four and a half thousand participants last year. In 2019 the team will continue to provide high quality and engaging spiritual formation and professional learning for Association members, Marist educators, Dioceses, and other Catholic groups throughout the country.

This year's theme for the Marist Association of St Marcellin Champagnat is inspired by GAUDETE ET EXSULTATE, the Apostolic Exhortation written by Pope Francis on the call to holiness in today's world. When published, this important document immediately attracted much attention among Marists throughout the world, such was its simplicity and resonances with the intuitions and emphases of Marist spirituality.

Water from the Rock suggests:

Daily experiences are special places of encounter with God. We find God's presence in creation, in the events of every day – work and relationships, silence and noise, joys and sorrows, achievements and anguish, tragedy and death.

The modest goal of Pope Francis in his document is shared this year by we Marists. Our goal is to repropose the call to holiness in a practical way for our own time, with all its risks, challenges and opportunities. The invitation to all Marists to experience opportunities for spiritual formation and learning are contained within these pages. Holy Today! is an invitation to **all** in the Association. In the words of Pope Francis,


To be holy does not require being a Bishop, a priest or a religious. We are frequently tempted to think that holiness is only for those who can withdraw from ordinary affairs to spend much time in prayer. That is not the case. We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves. Are you called to the consecrated life? Be holy by living out your commitment with joy. Are you married? Be holy by loving and caring for your husbandor wife, as Christ does for the Church. Do you work for a living? Be holy by labouring with integrity and skill in the service of your brothers and sisters. Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus. Are you in a position of authority? Be holy by working for the common good and renouncing personal gain.

May the call to be "Holy Today!" echo loudly through every week of the year ahead.

MELBOURNE Tuesday 21 May As Marists, we are constantly reminded that "the Spirit speaks God's love ever afresh into our world" and to be attuned with our "desire to be continually open to its movement and urgings" (Water from the Rock, 148), "to contemplate the world with the eyes and the heart of God" (WFR, 90).

The Marian Lecture 2019 will feature biblical scholar, author, poet and spiritual director, Dr Bonnie Thurston, who will draw on the rich tradition of contemplation and on being attentive to the "hints and glimpses" of the God within.

Dr Bonnie Thurston is a woman of prayer and in her book "For God Alone: A Primer on Prayer" speaks of contemplation as "the prayer of waiting, the quietening of the heart to rest in joy in the presence of God." This finds resonance in the life of Mary, a woman of contemplation who "pondered all things in her heart" (Lk 2:19).

Thomas Merton reminds us that "the spiritual life is first of all a life. It is not merely something to be known and studied, it is to be lived."

But how do we cultivate this inner awareness that escapes so many of us in our busy contemporary world? How do we challenge young people to "pay attention" to life and to live in harmony with each other, with the natural world and especially within themselves? How do we nurture a Catholic sacramental faith-imagination that recognises beauty and opens our eyes to new ways of seeing the world?

In keeping with the Association theme for 2019 "Holy. Today!," this program aims to:

- invite us "to get in touch with our inner selves to be able to discover a God of love who is revealed in the ordinary events of our lives." (Message of the 22nd General Chapter of the Marist Institute);
- explore key skills that cultivate awareness and attentiveness to the presence of God in everyday life:
- draw on expressions of contemporary art and music to share moments of the divine with others, especially young people.





TERTIARY, DIOCESAN, MARIST SCHOOLS AUSTRALIA & PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

A number of Marist programs have university accreditation and are also recognised by dioceses and state-based professional and educational bodies for meeting annual professional learning requirements.

The following programs have been accredited by Australian Catholic University at the Masters level (AQF level 9):

- 1. Footsteps 1 Making Jesus Christ Known and Loved

Masters and Graduate Certificate in Theology

The Australian Institute of Theological Education (BBI) offers the course RELT6032. People studying at Broken Bay can use the content from any of the five Marist programs listed above in their assignments for Broken Bay.

TERTIARY

Graduate Certificate Unit in Marist Methodology

This series of twelve, two-hour modules are taught biennially for staff in Marist Schools as part of the University of South Australia's Graduate Certificate Course. It is held in Adelaide. The course aims to help teachers apply Marist pedagogy in their professional practice serving to promote the flourishing of life for every child and the flourishing of the human community in light of the Catholic Christian understanding of the human person (or Catholic Christian Anthropology (CCA)).

The next program will be offered in 2020.

Marist Educational Leadership | \$1200.00 (plus an ACU marking fee where required)

This is a Postgraduate Master's level course offered annually for people studying at University, for those seeking accreditation with a Catholic Education authority, or for those who simply wish to learn more about Marist Leadership. The program focuses on educational leadership from a Marist perspective. internationally and nationally at both the system and school levels. It addresses the Marist enterprise within the context of the Catholic Church and local cultures.

Leadership from a Marian Perspective | \$1200.00 (plus an ACU marking fee where required)

The Australian Conference of the Marist Association acts in the name of the Church in 4 broad areas of ministry.

Marist Schools Australia

... is a family of 53 schools which draw on Marist spirituality and Marist educational practice to help them to shape their identity and mission as Catholic schools Of these schools 13 are solely governed by the Association and the rest are conducted in various partnership arrangements with dioceses and parishes. MSA schools, which help to educate over 40,000 young Australians, are grouped into three geographical Regions. Each Region is led by a Director who is advised by an MSA Regional Council

Marist Youth Ministry

... is a ministry aimed at young people aged between 15 and 25. MYM supports schoolbased and post-school programs. The principal school involvement is through the three-vear Christian leadership program known as Remar. A suite of post-school opportunities include praver and worship. service and solidarity. forums and festivals. campus ministry, and a university college. MYM operates in the same three Regions as MSA, with three Regional Coordinators and a number of part-time MYM Assistants and volunteers

Marist 180

... is the social welfare arm of the Association. It has a range of programs and projects for young people and families in most critical need. It is headquartered in western Sydney with a concentration of its programs there, but it has a growing presence across the country. It currently serves up to 6000 young people each year, with a staff of over three hundred. It has settlement and support services for refugees and migrants, foster care and out-ofhome care programs, educational and skills-training centres. services for indigenous and homeless youth.

Marist Solidarity

is the Association's agency for aid and development work through Asia and the Pacific Islands. Australian Marist Solidarity, a registered NGO, works with the people in this region through projects that empower local communities to take their own path to development. with an emphasis on redressing poverty through the provision of education It also offers educational and support services for MSA schools involved in solidarity and immersion projects, and is the base for Marist Volunteers Australia.

These ministries are currently supported by a number of Association-level teams and services: the MSA Leadership Team, the Mission and Life Formation Team, the Marist Association Pastoral Team, the Business Services Office, the Professional Standards Office, Marist Music, and The Hermitage at Mittagong – the national Marist retreat and conference centre.
