The 2020 Marist Formation theme is a line from *'The Summer Day,'* a poem by Mary Oliver, the Pulitzer Prize winning American poet.

'The Summer Day' is a meditation on nature, life and beauty. Its starting point is a question about origins and creation. It then focuses on one small, innocent creature - a grasshopper - and devolves into a reflection on awe and wonder. It ends where it started - with a question, or more a challenge - *"what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?"*

Over the last ten years the Marist Formation programs have rightly been recognised as amongst the best offerings available within the Australian Church to assist people reflect on and deepen their faith. In large part their strength has lain in careful selection of themes and creation of content. Contemporary issues, relevant themes and accessible approaches have marked the Marist Formation programs. This is again the situation for 2020.

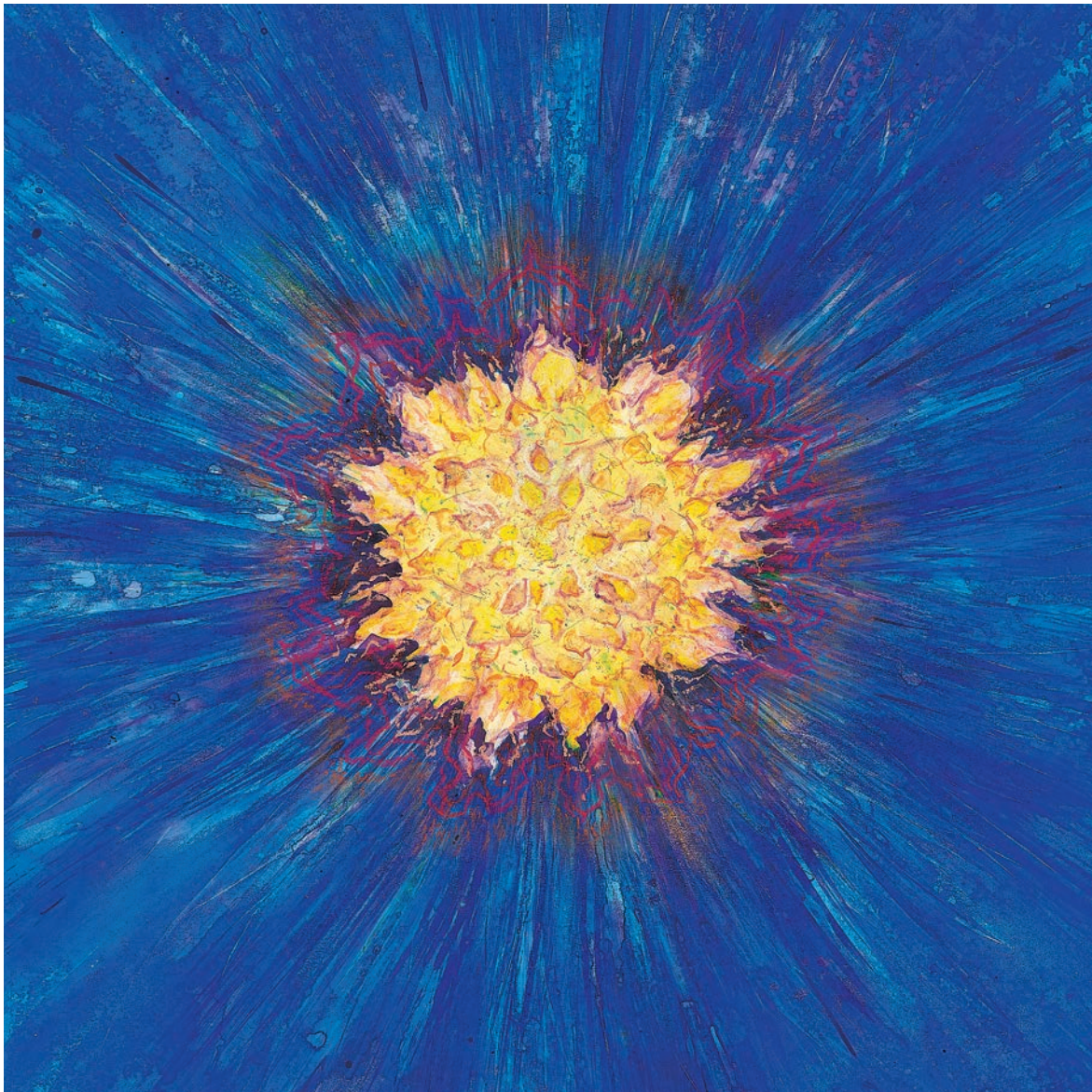
Our world and Church continue to be marked by the chaos of evolution. What was, is no longer; what is to come, is not yet clear. We are buffeted by a multitude of forces that would reduce our lives to producing and consuming. We are bombarded by the superficial and the fleeting. Religious affairs journalist and Vatican expert, Christopher Lamb, takes up the theme, 'One Wild and Precious Life – Creating One New Humanity,' through the lens of the Pontificate of Pope Francis.

The Marian Lecture for 2020 will be presented by British journalist, Christopher Lamb, who is currently the Rome Correspondent for *The Tablet*, an international Catholic publication based in the UK. He is also a contributor to the *BBC*, *La Stampa*, *Religion News Service* and others.

Christopher has lived in Rome for the past four years analysing and reporting on Pope Francis and the Vatican. He has travelled with the Pope on visits to Kenya, Uganda, Central African Republic, Egypt, Myanmar and Bangladesh while also covering his trips to the United States, Poland and Sweden. Christopher's latest book, *'The Outsider: Pope Francis and His Battle to Reform the Catholic Church'* will be released in April 2020.

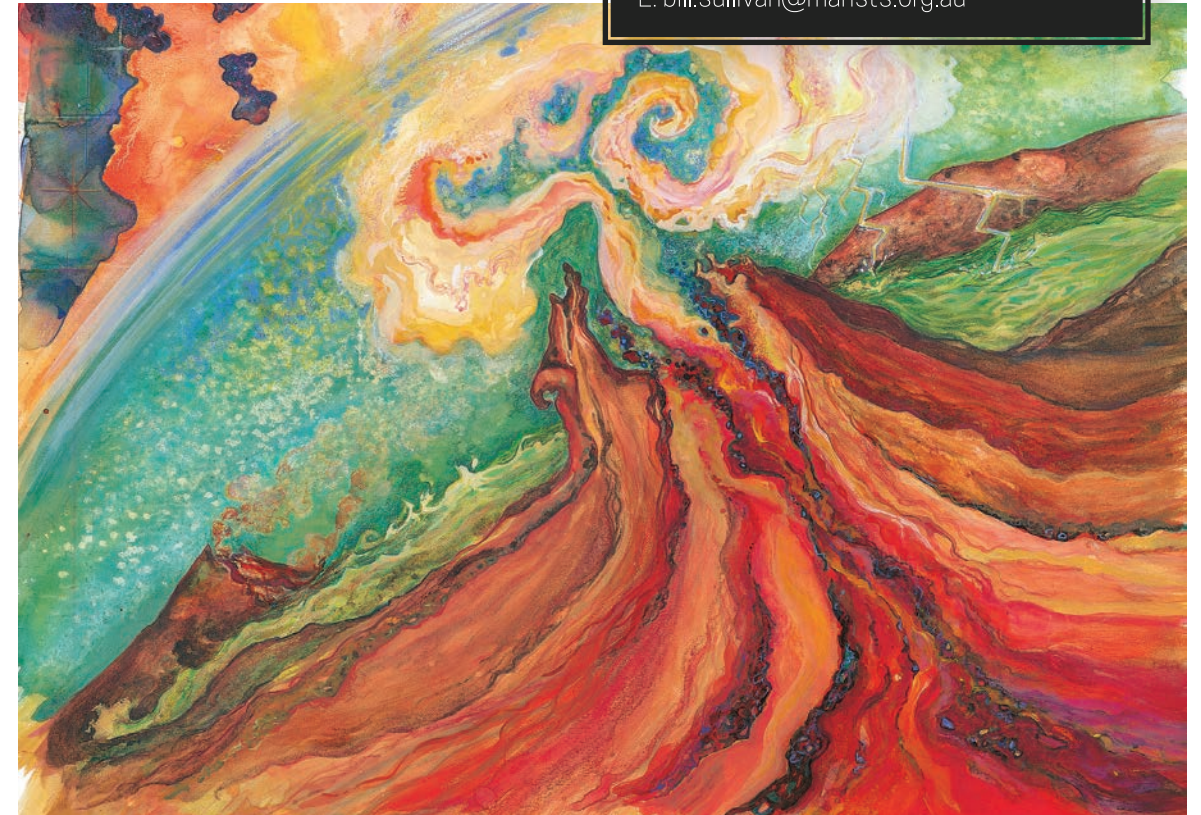

The national Marist Staff Spirituality program for 2020 (4-hour program).

Our journey towards freedom: desire for God and wholeness in our lives.

Our desire for God and wholeness is a journey towards freedom and an uncovering of what it means to be human. It calls us to examine the brevity and meaning of our lives, to reveal how all life is interconnected, and to consider how we might make the most of this one wild and precious life. Our response leads to a process of conversion and transformation, calling us to live with a deeper commitment to human dignity, thus inviting us to be a source of unity, in the creation of one new humanity.

The aim of the program is:

- To explore the nature of being human and to articulate its fundamental relationships - with one's self, with others, with God and with creation
- To examine the concept of one global community of life, of one human family, which is deeply interconnected with all life systems
- To grow in awareness of the impact and implications of the disconnect and disharmony that we experience within ourselves, with others, with God and with creation
- To engage in open dialogue that explores the universal sacredness and fundamental dignity of all people using a variety of contemporary mediums.

Marist Tertiary EDUCATION

TERTIARY, DIOCESAN, MARIST SCHOOLS AUSTRALIA & PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

A number of Marist programs have university accreditation and are also recognised by dioceses and state-based professional and educational bodies for meeting annual professional learning requirements.

The following programs have been accredited by Australian Catholic University at the Masters level (AQF level 9):

1. Footsteps 1 - Making Jesus Christ Known and Loved
2. Footsteps 2 - Making Jesus Christ Known and Loved
3. Marist Pilgrimage & Study Tour
4. Marist Educational Leadership Program
5. Leadership from a Marian Perspective

Masters and Graduate Certificate in Theology

The Australian Institute of Theological Education (BBI) offers the course RELT6032. People studying at Broken Bay can use the content from any of the five Marist programs listed above in their assignments for Broken Bay.

Graduate Certificate Unit in Marist Methodology

This series of 12, two-hour modules are taught biennially for staff in Marist Schools as part of the University of South Australia's Graduate Certificate Course. It is held in Adelaide. The course aims to help teachers apply Marist pedagogy in their professional practice serving to promote the flourishing of life for every child and the flourishing of the human community in light of the Catholic Christian understanding of the human person (or Catholic Christian Anthropology (CCA)).

Marist Educational Leadership*

This is a Postgraduate Master's level course offered annually for people studying at university, for those seeking accreditation with a Catholic Education authority, or for those who simply wish to learn more about Marist Leadership. The program focuses on educational leadership from a Marist perspective, internationally and nationally, at both the system and school levels. It addresses the Marist enterprise within the context of the Catholic Church and local cultures.

In 2020, this course will be offered as a 2-day program at Marist Centre Mascot, Sydney. For those seeking Tertiary Accreditation there will be an additional on-line component.

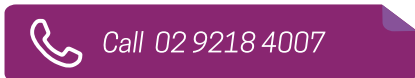

The Australian Conference of the Marist Association acts in the name of the Church in four broad areas of ministry.

Marist Schools Australia

... is a family of 53 schools which draw on Marist spirituality and Marist educational practice to help them to shape their identity and mission as Catholic schools. Of these schools, 13 are solely governed by the Association and the rest are conducted in various partnership arrangements with dioceses and parishes. MSA schools, which help to educate over 40,000 young Australians, are grouped into three geographical Regions. Each Region is led by a Director who is advised by an MSA Regional Council.

Marist Youth Ministry

... is a ministry aimed at young people aged between 12 and 25. MYM supports school-based and young adult programs. The principal school involvement is through the six-year Christian leadership program known as Game Changers. A suite of post-school opportunities include prayer and worship, service and solidarity, forums and festivals, together with a range of local and international volunteering opportunities. MYM operates in all MSA regions, with Regional Coordinators and a number of part-time MYM assistants and volunteers.

Marist 180

... is the social welfare arm of the Association. Marist180 has a range of programs and services that connect with and support young people and families in most critical need. It is headquartered in Western Sydney with a presence in Orange, Newcastle and Brisbane. Marist180 provides skills training and services for Aboriginal engagement, homelessness, family preservation and refugee settlement. They also provide Intensive Therapeutic Care for young people living in Marist180 out-of-home care.

Marist Solidarity

... is the Association's agency for aid and development work through Asia and the Pacific Islands. Australian Marist Solidarity, a registered NGO, works with the people in this region through projects that empower local communities to take their own path to development, with an emphasis on redressing poverty through the provision of education. It also offers educational and support services for MSA schools involved in solidarity and immersion projects, and is the base for Marist Volunteers Australia.

These ministries are currently supported by a number of Association-level teams and services: the MSA Leadership Team, the Mission and Life Formation Team, the Marist Association Pastoral Team, the Business Services Office, the Professional Standards Office, Marist Music, and The Hermitage at Mittagong – the national Marist retreat and conference centre.
